The first step in adding a ringtone to your phone is to find the one you like. In general, this means checking one of the dozens of pages with ringtones on the Internet and choosing a good one that is compatible with the phone model. Some sites charge a fee for the use of ringtones, to cover royalties for songs, among other things, and some sites provide sounds for free. Many older songs (such as classic songs) have been around long enough that their copyrights have expired - they have entered the public domain, so they can be free for anyone. Once you find the ringtone you like, you just need to enter it into your phone's memory. There are many different ways to do this, depending on your specific phone model. The three main ways to add a new ringtone are: Ad To reload the ringtone program to your phone from your computer, using a data cable. Send the program to your phone via radio waves. Type the program directly into your phone using the keyboard. Phones can only use one specific method, but many phones have multiple options. Check the user manual to find out what your phone can do. If you have the right phone, software and computer configuration, loading ringtones via data link or infrared interface may be the easiest option, but it requires some work and expense to set up everything initially. A more popular method is to send a new ringtone to your phone via radio waves. This approach comes from Nokia, but other manufacturers have since added this capability to their phones. The basic idea is to send your phone a special kind of text message that includes a ringtone program - on most phones it is done using Short Message Service technology or enhanced messaging service. Nokia originally developed short message service for sending short text messages between phones. Later, Nokia and Intel created smart messages, a special protocol for sending functional, non-textual information via SMS. Basically, the smart SMS message is encoded to allow the equipped phone to recognize it as graphics, ringtone, etc. The most common method of transmitting ringtones over radio waves is by Website rings, selects the tone, enters the phone number, and allows site administrators to send messages directly to the phone. Alternatively, you can use the SMS gateway site to send a specific message to your phone This means finding the ringtone code you want, finding it in the right format (Nokia binary format, for example) and copying it as a smart message. Mobile phones with composer melodies allow you to write ringtones directly. The easiest way to use this feature is to find the right keystroke sequence for your web melody. This sequence will tell you which buttons to press on your phone, in composer mode, to program the ringtone you want (check the user manual for details on the phone composer mode). Of course, for the ringtone to work, the sequence must be in the correct format. Fortunately, you can find plenty of sequences online for most phone models. As mobile phones evolve, ringtones will become more complicated as well. Already some phones boast of the possibility of polyphonic ringtones, which means that the phone can play more than one note at a time, which allows for richer, harmonized melodies. Some new phones allow you to record songs and voice messages for ringtones yourself. Many of these models also allow you to assign different ringtones to different incoming numbers, so you know who's calling without even looking at your phone. Soon, ringtones will be completed with alien thrills to the essential function of the phone. Ringtones allow you to customize your iPhone with melodies and sounds that you like, even allowing you to assign specific ringtones to different contacts. The easiest way to add a ringtone to your iPhone is to buy it from the iTunes Store, usually for 99 cents or \$1.29. But if you prefer not to spend money, create free ringtones using songs you already own, or visit a website that offers free, legal ringtones for download. The information in this article applies to any iPhone. While this requires some effort, it's possible to create a new ringtone from a song you already own in your iTunes library. To do this, select the song you have saved to your local hard drive; Your song can't be in the cloud or stream from the Internet. You can't create ringtones from songs in your library that you've downloaded from Apple Music; Purchase the song from iTunes or import it from your CD. The maximum length of the bell is 40 seconds; for text message tones, the maximum length is 30 seconds. Mac users: Choose preferences & iTunes & general. Windows users: Choose Edit & Preferences & General. At the bottom of the window, click Import Settings. In the Import Settings window, go to the Settings drop-down list. (Notice which setting is currently selected so that you can return to the end of the process and restore them to their original selection). Choose High Quality (128 kbps) from the menu, and then select OK. Make sure AAC is also selected as the import format if it is not already there. Find the song in your iTunes library. Listen to it and make a note of the beginning and end clip you want to enter in the ringtone. Right-click the song and choose About The Song. Select the Options tab. Enter the start and stop times recorded in the available fields. On the iTunes menu, choose File & Convert & Create AAC version. This creates a new file that contains only the clip between the start and stop times you set. Find the newly created music clip file in iTunes (it will have the same name as the original song, but with a short time). Right-click the new file and select Show in Finder. In the Finder window, right-click the new file and choose Rename. Change the extension from m4a to m4r (m4r is the file extension for ringtones) and press Enter. You have now created a new ringtone! You don't need the clip in your iTunes library before you can delete it. In iTunes, right-click the new file name and choose Remove from Library. When asked if you want to remove the song from your iTunes library, choose Delete Song. When asked if you want to move a song to the Recycle Bin, click Keep File. When you're done creating the ringtone, go back and remove the start and stop times of the original song and restore the initial import settings. In your iTunes library, select the original song file. Right-click the song and choose About The Song. Click the Options tab and check the boxes next to Start and Stopped. Click OK. Then restore the changes to the import settings. Choose iTunes (on mac) or Edit (on Windows PC) & preferences & general. Choose Import Settings. Select Drop-down Settings and select the original setting. Once you've created the ringtone file, add it to your iPhone. Connect your iPhone to your computer. (Unlock your iPhone if prompted.) At the top of the iTunes window, select your iPhone. In the left sidebar, under On my device, choose Sounds. If you don't see the left sidebar in iTunes, choose View & Show Sidebar. In the Finder window, drag the new m4r ringtone file into iTunes and drop it in the Sounds folder. At the bottom of the iTunes window, choose Sync. When sync is complete, the new ringtone will be next to all the other ringtones on your iPhone. If you want to take a chance outside of iTunes, there are websites that offer ringtones for free. The problem, however, is to make sure that your source is really free and legal (not restricted to copyright use). Here are some websites that offer legally free ringtones. These sites also offer other content, such as videos, games, apps, and wallpapers. Zedge website A wide range of ringtones including songs, sounds and other random sounds and effects. (Wallpapers are mixed with offers.) There is a Zedge app for Android users in the Google Play store that offers ringtones and wallpapers. However, the Zedge iPhone app only offers wallpapers.
